

Waste Collection Overview

Fortnightly (Non-recyclables) & Weekly (Recyclables & Food Waste) Collections on Mondays 7.00 a.m. from end of drive (put out Sunday evening*).

- **Fortnightly (bi-weekly) Non-recyclables Refuse** : grey wheelie bin every other Monday*
- **Weekly Recyclables** : green boxes, white sack, silver food caddy collection every Monday*.

***note any collection day changes due to bank holidays or festive periods.**



If you are confused or unsure which bin, box or sack to put waste into please place it in a bin bag first (not loose) and then into the grey wheelie bin.
On each collection the binmen inspect the different containers and will not collect if waste is misallocated!



After each collection please retrieve from the end of the drive either the wheelie bin, green boxes, white sack and/or silver caddy. Any container left at the end of the drive will be lost or fly-tipped into.

Then place the bin and other containers outside the cottage again as required:

No.1 Moulton Farm Cottage - to the right of the cottage, next to the white meter cabinet door set in the wall.

No.2 Moulton Farm Cottage - beneath the kitchen window, otherwise No.3 cottage will use them.

Green Box 1

Weekly Collection *Monday 7.00 a.m.* from end of drive (put out Sunday evening).

If possible clip on black lid supplied.

After collection please retrieve and place outside cottage again.



Paper

- Mixed Paper
- Magazine, brochures & catalogues
- White paper (e.g. computer paper, letters etc.)
- Envelopes (no plastic)
- Junk mail

Glass bottles & jars

- Bottles of any colour (e.g. wine, beer, sauce, oil etc.)
- Jars of any colour (e.g. jam, sauce, baby food etc.)
- Non-food bottles and jars (e.g. perfume, aftershave, face creams)

Items must be sorted by material type within the box.

Paper must be free of dirt, food or paint.

Dirty or greasy paper (such as chip shop wrappers) should go in your grey bin.

Metal lids and caps should go in the reusable white sack.

Green Box 2

Weekly Collection *Monday 7.00 a.m.* from end of drive (put out Sunday evening).

If possible clip on black lid supplied.

After collection please retrieve and place outside cottage again.



Cardboard

- Cardboard boxes (e.g. cereal boxes, dishwasher tablet boxes)
- Corrugated cardboard
- Online delivery boxes & cardboard envelopes
- Greetings cards - no glitter
- Egg boxes
- Brown paper
- Food & Drink Cartons

Batteries & Printer Cartridges

- All household batteries including 'button' batteries from watches, hearing aids etc.
- Battery packs from household tools, laptops or phones.
- All household printer cartridges.

Items must be sorted by material type within the box.

Cardboard must be free of dirt, food or paint. Dirty or greasy cardboard (such as takeaway pizza boxes) should go in your grey bin.

Pieces of cardboard can be placed alongside Box 2 if your box is full, as long as they are under 75cm long.

Batteries should be placed in a small clear tied bag, such as a sandwich bag or empty bread bag. Cover the contacts on lithium and button batteries with sticky tape to reduce fire risk.

Reusable White Sack

Weekly Collection *Monday 7.00 a.m.* from end of drive (put out Sunday evening).

After collection please retrieve and place inside/outside cottage again.

	<h3>Household Plastic Packaging</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Detergent & soap bottles (no pumps)• Cleaning product bottles• Skin care product bottles• Pop & water bottles• Milk bottles• Pots (e.g. yoghurt, soup)• Tubs (e.g. margarine, ice cream)• Trays and punnets (meat trays, takeaway trays, fruit & veg trays)• Plant pots (not black ones)	<h3>Household metal packaging</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Drink cans• Food tins• Biscuit or chocolate tins• Aerosols (empty)• Aluminium Foil• Foil Trays (takeaway trays)• Aluminium tubes (e.g. tomato puree)• Metal lids from jars & bottles

Empty all packaging & rinse clean. Replace bottle lids & tops, and flatten bottles where possible. You can leave labels on all packaging, but place film lids, absorbent pads etc. into your grey bin.

Remember, no plastic films or black plastic.

Silver Food Waste Large Caddy (stored outside cottage)

Weekly Collection *Monday 7.00 a.m.* from end of drive (put out Sunday evening).

After collection please retrieve and place outside cottage again.



Use small caddy
in the kitchen.

Food Waste Collections

- Both cooked and uncooked food taken.
- You can line the caddy with any bag, such as cereal bags, bread bags, salad bags and so on.
Alternatively you can line the caddy with newspaper.
- When your indoor caddy is full, transfer the waste to the larger caddy.
- Put the large caddy out at the end of the drive on collection day.
Please retrieve after collection.

Silver Large Caddy



Rotate handle forward to lock the lid in place and to prevent content spills.
